Kingsburg Kick-Back

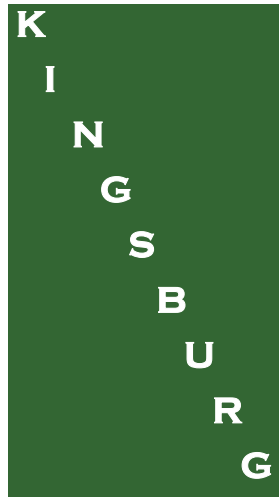


This event is sponsored by the Leadership Class, which will be providing snacks and refreshments for the event.

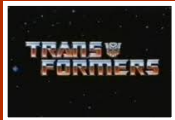
