YEAR-END CHECKLIST

As every school year comes to a close, it is important to monitor all those last minute "chores" that need doing. Make sure to:

- Schedule final meeting(s) with your charter teacher to review last bits of coursework, and check-in curriculum (teachers must do computer inventory).
- Students returning in the fall should indicate their intentions to their charter teacher, and schedule an initial appointment for August. It is also a good idea to review academic standing and progress towards graduation, as well as indicate which classes you intend to take in the fall. This allows your charter teacher to get a head-start on preparing your fall semester contract papers.
- Complete year-end parent survey and emergency reference card for next year.
- Students desiring a "head-start" on fall work may check out curriculum in advance. Again, your charter teacher needs to do this for you.
- Complete final attendance sheet promptly (to avoid frantic phone calls from your charter teacher).
- Return all library materials to the school library. Check-in needs to be done by a charter teacher or Diane Kraft, librarian.
- Save personal files or data stored on school computers onto a flash drive.
- Make one last pass through the lost and found (in the lobby) for that sweater you lost in November.
