Grammar – did the student show thoughtfulness in regards to known grammar rules? Evaluate work to teach those principles for later student demonstration.

Spelling – is the student taking the time and concern to spell correctly? If spelling is a difficulty, have student proof read their assignments.

Neatness – this is a reflection on format, effort, and courtesy to the teacher. Neatness includes penmanship and organization.
